

Colonel Rich Wood began his military career in 1993 as a combat medic and completed his enlistment as a staff sergeant. In 2000, he attended the University of Tampa as an active-duty Green to Gold ROTC Scholarship Program cadet and graduated in 2002 with a Bachelor of Arts in Psychology. He received the Outstanding Senior Award from the University of Tampa Alumni Association, earned the Distinguished Military Graduate distinction, and was commissioned into the Medical Service Corps. COL Wood holds a Master of Science in National Resource Strategy from the National Defense University, a Master of Science in Disaster Relief Logistics from the Florida Institute of Technology (FIT), and a Master of Arts in Leadership and Management from Webster University.

Colonel Wood served in various duty positions and assignments throughout his career. At Fort Campbell, Kentucky, he served as Medical Platoon Leader and later Executive Officer for Headquarters and Headquarters Company (HHC), 1-502d Infantry Battalion (OIF I). In South Korea, he served as Deputy Commander for Operations for the US Army Medical Materiel Center-Korea at Camp Carroll and later at Yongsan as S4/Chief of Logistics for the 65th Medical Brigade/Medical Department Activity-Korea. At Fort Hood, Texas, he served as Executive Officer for the 1st Medical Brigade and Deputy Commander for Operations for Task Force 1st MED at Qatar (OSS 18). At the Pentagon, Virginia, he served on the Joint Staff as Chief of Operations and Logistics, Office of the Joint Staff Surgeon. Most recently, he served as Commander of the 168th Multi-functional Medical Battalion at Camp Walker, Daegu, South Korea.
