

Lt. Col. Marimon Maskell enlisted in the U.S. Army in 1999 as a Licensed Practical Nurse (91C). Her first assignment was the 86<sup>th</sup> Combat Support Hospital at Fort Campbell, Kentucky, where she deployed in Support of Task Force Med Falcon at Camp Bondsteel, Kosovo and Operation Iraqi Freedom/Operation Enduring Freedom I, assigned to the Intensive Care Unit Platoon. She completed her enlisted career as a Staff Sergeant.

In 2005, she attended Hawai'i Pacific University's Nursing program while attending the University of Hawai'i Reserve Officer Training Corps' Green to Gold program. She graduated with a Bachelor of Science in Nursing and was commissioned as a Second Lieutenant Army Nurse with the Distinguished Military Graduate distinction in August 2007. In 2024, Lt. Col. Maskell received a Master of Science in Nursing Education from Aspen University.

Lt. Col. Maskell has had a multitude of duty positions and assignments that have shaped her career. Her first assignment upon commissioning was at Tripler Army Medical Center, HI, serving as a Medical/Surgical nurse on the Ortho-Neuro-Vascular unit (6B2) before attending the OB/GYN (66G) course, then transferred to the Labor & Delivery (L&D) unit as a staff nurse. At Brian Allgood Army Community Hospital, Yongsan, South Korea, she initially served as an Obstetrics & Gynecology (OB/GYN) Clinic staff nurse then as the Clinical Nurse Officer in Charge (CNOIC) of the Women & Infant Care Unit. She was the 38<sup>th</sup> Parallel Nursing Society President during her time there. At Womack Army Medical Center, Fort Bragg, NC, she served as an L&D staff nurse prior to moving to the OB/GYN Clinic to serve as the Centering Pregnancy Program Coordinator then as the CNOIC and Health System Specialist of the clinic. She also served as the Pregnancy Postpartum Physical Training (P3T) Program Manager and Education Coordinator for XVIII Airborne Corps. Next, she served at William Beaumont Army Medical Center, Fort Bliss, TX as the CNOIC of the Mother Baby Unit (MBU) then L&D. She also supported Fort Bliss as the P3T Installation Program Manager. At Landstuhl Regional Medical Center, Landstuhl, Germany, she served as the CNOIC of L&D then the OB/GYN Clinic. She then served as the Global Health Engagement Officer with the Commander's Initiative Group prior to completing her assignment as the Chief of the Women's Health Service Line and supported Operation Allies Refuge and Operation Allies Welcome. She recently returned to Tripler Army Medical Center as the Director of Maternal Child Health.
